Petitioner Robert J. Harko filed a petition for extraordinary relief. He asked the Court to order the Secretary to complete the development the Board of Veterans' Appeals ordered in a November 30, 2017, remand order.

Petitioner has filed a motion to dismiss his petition because VA has provided the relief he sought the Court to compel. The Secretary is unopposed to petitioner's motion. Based on the foregoing, petitioner's request for a writ of mandamus is moot because he has obtained all the relief he requested. *See, e.g., Thomas v. Brown*, 9 Vet.App. 269, 270 (1996) (per curiam); *Mokal v. Derwinski*, 1 Vet.App. 12, 15 (1990). Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that petitioner's motion to dismiss his petition is granted. It is further

ORDERED that the action is DISMISSED. And it is further

ORDERED, pursuant to Rule 41(b)(3) of the Court's Rules of Practice and Procedure, that this order shall serve as the mandate of the Court.
