On February 18, 2020, the petitioner and personal representative of veteran Roy M. Scott's estate, Sarah E. Napora, through counsel filed a petition for extraordinary relief in the form of a writ of mandamus compelling VA to pay to the veteran's estate past-due benefits that were transferred to the veteran's bank account prior to his death, but subsequently returned to VA by the financial institution or, in the alternative, to issue a decision on the issue. Petition at 1-3, 8; *see* Exhibits A, G. The Court ordered the Secretary to respond to the petition, and on April 22, 2020, the petitioner moved to voluntarily dismiss the petition. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the petitioner's April 22, 2020, motion is granted. It is further

ORDERED that the petitioner's February 18, 2020, petition for extraordinary relief in the form of a writ of mandamus is DISMISSED.
