### **REPLY TO THE SECRETARY'S OPPOSITION TO EAJA PETITION**

NOW COMES BEFORE this honorable Court Appellant Alfred Procopio. Jr., who replies to the Secretary's Opposition to Appellant's Application for Fees under the Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA).

Based on the decision of the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, the opposition filed by the Secretary and the denial of *certiorari*, by the Supreme Court of the United States, Appellant has decided to waive earned fees under the Equal Access to Justice Act and withdraw the pending application. Appellant disagrees that the Secretary's position was substantially justified or that any award should be reduced based on the Secretary's unreasonable demand for further specificity, but concedes, after exhaustive research that the law of the case doctrine does control. This, of course, moots the other issues. To save the Court's time from reviewing a long and probably futile argument, Appellant has decided that further proceedings on this issue are counterproductive. WHEREFORE, Appellant withdraws his application for attorney fees under the

Equal Access to Justice Act.
