On May 7, 2020, the Court issued a memorandum decision in the case of pro se appellant John D. Wilson, Jr., which remanded his claim of service connection for an acquired psychiatric disorder and personality disorder. On May 13, 2020, the appellant submitted to the Court a document styled as a "motion to voluntarily dismiss" his appeal. In this motion, the appellant stated that he wished to dismiss his current appeal, but that he requests an opportunity to "rehear" and "revise" this opinion to the Board of Veterans' Appeals at a "later date."

Upon a liberal reading of the filing, the Court stayed the case and referred Mr. Wilson to The Veterans Consortium Pro Bono Program for assistance.² On June 26, 2020, the appellant filed a document styled as a "motion to reinstate my appeal." Because the document expresses the desire for this appeal to continue, the Court will lift its stay of proceedings, grant the appellant's motion to reinstate the appeal, and treat his motion to dismiss as moot.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the June 3, 2020, stay of proceedings is lifted. It is further
