On June 1, 2021, in a panel decision, the Court affirmed an April 17, 2019, decision of the Board of Veterans' Appeals that denied entitlement to reimbursement for medical expenses incurred outside of the United States in May 2016 and May 2018. Thereafter, the appellant sought panel reconsideration. "[A] motion for . . . panel [reconsideration] . . . shall state the points of law or fact that the party believes the Court has overlooked or misunderstood." U.S. VET. APP. R. 35(e)(1). The Court did not overlook or misunderstand any argument that was properly before it.

Upon consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED that the motion for reconsideration by the panel is denied.
