**ORDER**

On July 15, 2020, the petitioners filed a petition seeking extraordinary relief in the nature of a writ of mandamus. On October 2, 2020, the petitioners filed a motion for the Court to certify a class of individuals. On April 19, 2021, the Court issued a panel order granting the petition for a writ of mandamus and granting the motion for class certification. On May 10, 2021, the Secretary filed a motion for full-Court review of the panel order.

"Motions for full-Court review are not favored. Ordinarily they will not be granted unless such action is necessary to secure or maintain uniformity of the Court's decisions or to resolve a question of exceptional importance." U.S. VET. APP. R. 35(c). In this matter, the Secretary has not shown that either basis exists to warrant full-Court review.

Upon consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED that the motion for full-Court review is denied.
