ORDER

Veteran Jose Rivera-Colon through counsel appeals a June 12, 2019, Board of Veterans' Appeals (Board) decision finding, among other things, that he was not entitled to an evaluation in excess of 10% for gastritis. On July 30, 2021, the appeal was referred to a panel of the Court for decision, and oral argument is scheduled for October 12, 2021.

On September 2, 2021, the Court ordered the parties to file supplemental memoranda of law within 14 days. That same day, technical difficulties rendered the Court's electronic filing system inaccessible to outside parties. On September 7, 2021, the Secretary filed an unopposed motion notifying the Court that, because of the technical difficulties, he could not access the September 2, 2021, order until five days after it issued. The Secretary requested a commensurate five-day extension of time to file his memorandum of law. Because the inaccessibility was outside the parties' control, the Court will grant both parties a five-day extension of time, until September 21, 2021, to file their supplemental memoranda of law.

Upon consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED that the parties are granted an extension of time, until September 21, 2021, to serve on each other and file with the Court supplemental memoranda of law, not exceeding 15 pages, addressing the issues identified in the September 2, 2021, order.
